Map Views

You can view the map two ways; either embedded in the Zuercher Mobile (appearing in the upper or lower section in place of Calls, Units, or one of the other options) or in a separate window. If it is embedded you can see the map and the call information at the same time. You can also expand or shrink either the call or map window using the  or  buttons.

You can have the map open in BOTH the embedded and separate window.


Manipulating the Map

You can use the links on the left side of the map to select options and features. You can also use the buttons in the lower righthand corner:

- The arrows (and keyboard arrow keys) move the map
-  and  zoom in and out
-  Allows you to draw a box to zoom in
-  Get detailed information for a point such as an address point, CFS, or parcel.
-  Expands the map so you see the whole county

Creating a Call for Service

You can create a call for service using the map.

- Click the  button or **Get Location Info** link
- Click on the map where you want to create the CFS.
- Click the **New CAD CFS** link at the bottom of the **Location Information** window that comes up.
- Select **Coordinates**, **Nearest Intersection** or **Nearest Address**. Note that **Coordinates** will just enter the Lat/Long for the address of the CFS.

Finding GPS Coordinates

You can get Latitude and Longitude using the Info button.

- Click the **Info** button
- Click on the map at the location you need GPS coordinates.
- The Latitude and Longitude will be at the top of the **Location Information** window that comes up.

House pictures

You can see the house pictures by using the **Get Location Info** link in the main window and then clicking on the dot associated with an address point or searching for an address.

In the **Location Information** window that comes up, click on the link next to **Address Images**. If you don't see that link, make sure you clicked (precisely) on the red dot representing the address point.

Routing

If you create a route between a unit and a call or address, the map will zoom in to show the unit and the call or address, and show the shortest route between them, taking into account road closures. You can create a route by either:

- Using the **Routing** link on the left side of the map.
- Clicking on a call and clicking the **Route** link at the bottom of the screen that comes up.
- Note – the route calculated is the shortest distance, not necessarily the best or fastest route.

Following

If you click the “Follow Me” link on the left side of the map, the map will keep you in view at whatever zoom level your map is set to. If you click on anything on the map, it will turn off “Follow Me” mode.

Map Layers

- You can update how much information you can see on your map using the **Show or Hide Map Layers** button. This includes enabling:
 - Night Mode
 - Aerial view

Bookmarks

A bookmark gives you the ability to reset all the map settings to previously known settings.

To select the default settings for the Sheriff's Office, click the **Bookmarks** link and then click **Open** next to **WCSD Default**.

After personalizing your map settings, you can save your own bookmark to easily get back to those settings.

Zoom Level

Map features will appear based on how far in you are zoomed.

On an MDT with standard resolution, address points should appear when you can see about 1/2 mile North/South and East/West.

Finding Addresses

Instead of panning around to find an address, you can use the **Search** link on the left side.

In the dialog box that comes up, if you only search for the numeric part of the address, it will show you all the addresses with that house number. You can then double-click on the address to find it.

If you want to zoom in to an address, click the **Zoom** link at the bottom of the address window.

Usually, less is better when searching for an address.
